Leaving a Legacy



BASIC OPTIONS

- 1. Include a Gift in your Will or Trust (see below for sample wording)
 - a. You describe how you want your gift used
 - b. You define the gift as a certain dollar amount or as a percentage of your estate.

Advantage: Gifts in a will or trust may be changed at any time.

- 2. Make a Gift from your 401(k), IRA or other Retirement Plan
 - a. You name the North Carolina State University Foundation, Inc. as the primary or secondary beneficiary of the plan.
 - b. You designate what percentage of the plan is for the Foundation.
 - c. This estate gift may be created without an attorney.

Advantage: A person receiving this money would ultimately pay income taxes on it, but the North Carolina State University Foundation, Inc. would not.

- 3. Give a Gift and Receive Income Back
 - a. Receive income payments for life after creating a charitable gift annuity with the North Carolina State University Foundation, Inc.
 - b. Payments may begin immediately or at a future date.
 - c. Income payments are based on the age(s) of the income recipient(s).

ADVANCED OPTIONS (These options require discussion with a legal or tax advisor)

- 1. Charitable remainder trust (including FLIP trusts for real estate)
- 2. Charitable lead trust
- 3. Gift of closely-held stock, partnerships, or business interests
