HUB Overview





The HUB Office



The Office for Historically Underutilized Businesses promotes diversity and inclusion in state government procurement and contracting.

The main roles of the HUB Office include:

- HUB Certification (HUB)
- NC Small Business Enterprise Certification (NCSBE)
- Advocacy and Business Development services
- Compliance & Reporting
- Minority Business Development Agency Business
 Center





What is a HUB?



- Per NC General Statute 143-128.4
- At least 51% of business is owned by one or more persons who are members of at least one of the groups in 143-128.4 (b).
- The <u>management</u> and daily business operations must be <u>controlled</u> by at least one owner in one of the groups in 143-128.4 (b).
- HUB Certification Categories:
 - Black
 - Hispanic
 - Asian American
 - American Indian
 - Female
 - Disabled
 - Disadvantaged
- Employee Stock Ownership Plan (ESOP New category)



HUB Certification Process



- Certification is valid for 4 years with optional 4 year renewal
- Takes about 45-90 days to get certified
- There is no fee to be certified
- Reciprocity options exist, making it easier to get HUB certified if a firm is already certified in NC or a surrounding state



Where are NCSBEs in North Carolina? —



- Headquartered in NC
- For Profit
- \$1.5 Million in Annual Revenue or less (after cost of goods sold)
- 100 or fewer employees

Certification managed by the HUB Office.
Lasts four years.

Legislative Background



- Goal of 10% established in <u>Executive Order Number 25</u>
- NC General Statute 143-48
 - State policy to encourage use of small and Historically Underutilized Businesses
 - Reporting requirements
- NC General Statute 143-128.4: Statewide Uniform Certification
 - Defines Historically Underutilized Business
 - Department of Administration certifies HUBs and maintains database
 - Only Certified HUBs count toward minority business participation

Partnering with the HUB Office





Partnering with the HUB Office

HUB mission alignment: HUB holds outreach and training events with local and state government entities, community colleges, public universities, and partner organizations to aid in increasing minority /woman owned business participation.

Events Focus: HUB certification process, trainings (how to do business with the state), connecting HUB vendors with agency purchasers, introducing government staff to HUB requirements and resources, and sharing industry best practices.



Partnering with the HUB Office - Examples

- Annual Procurement Education and Knowledge (PEAK) Conference
- Annual State Construction Conference the HUB Office hosts a networking reception and vendor expo (w/some opportunities for in-kind participation).
- Annual Minority Enterprise Development Week (MED Week) State and local level events -(HUB hosts an event for statewide participation including an expo with opportunities to exhibit / local events held around the state)
- Rural Summit (HUB participates as an exhibitor)
- UNC School of Government courses (we routinely have a section in the Construction Contracting course and participate in others related to the NC MWBE Coordinators Network's Certified Economic Inclusion Officer (CEIO) program)
- Association meetings such as the NC Association of Governmental Purchasers (NCAGP), NC Association of Community College Business Officers (NCACCBO)
- Industry organizations such as the United Minority Contractors of NC (UMCNC), Hispanic Contractors Association of the Carolinas (HCAC) and the NC MWBE Coordinators Network



Event/Training Request

The HUB Office receives requests for outreach and training through multiple avenues including word of mouth, walk-ins, email, phone calls, social media and the outreach & training request form.

- ❖The outreach/training request form is the preferred method for receiving requests. <u>Outreach/Training Request Form | NC DOA</u>
- ❖ Initial details that are pertinent to the success of the event include: verifying the requesting agency or organization, confirming the need of the agency, confirming the role of the HUB Office and knowing the intended targeted audience.



Audience/Attendees

It is critical to know the audience intended for each event. This drives the platform or venue choice, how the event will be marketed, HUB staff attendance, how the engagement or exhibit will be set-up, and materials/hand-outs needed.

❖ New business owners/non-certified attendees/General Public (often wants to know -Who/What is HUB, how to become HUB certified, maneuver through the HUB application process, gain access to contracting)

Potential vendors should ideally complete certification training to gain an understanding of HUB certification and how to effectively use the certification.

HUB shares information about the HUB Office, HUB certification, Certification training sessions, instruction on certification application completion, business development resources and a business card for the team member that can best assist.

Minimal information shared is QR code access to the HUB website to learn about the HUB Office, and the HUB Office Introduction/Overview handout.

❖ HUB Certified Vendors/ Certified Others (often wants to know -how to become HUB certified, gain access to contracting, understand bid solicitations, how to win bids, access to grants)

Recommend P101 training sessions/Reciprocity/MBDA Center Resources/Direct to HUB website (specifically to Bid Solicitations Portal, Business Resource page, Events/Training page & IPS), Share business development access.

Minimal information shared is QR code access to the HUB website to learn about the HUB Office, and the HUB Office Introduction/Overview handout



Audience/Attendees (cont'd)

❖ State agencies (often wants to know - who is HUB? How do I find HUB Vendors? How do I increase HUB participation?)

Requires continuous education regarding how the Office for Historically Underutilized Businesses supports their agency.

HUB shares the HUB Office Introduction/Overview handout, the QR code access to the HUB website to learn about the HUB Office, business card for the team member that can best assist.

❖ Advocacy Partners/Industry Partners/Private Corporations (How can we support HUB, form partnerships, help educate certified vendors, find HUB vendors, Increase HUB participation)

Events together are usually educational, information exchange, professional development, and training,

Minimally, HUB shares QR code access to the HUB website and the HUB Office Introduction/Overview handout



Hosting Vendor Engagements

- The HUB office can assist with hosting vendor engagements
- Vendor engagement events may be virtual or in-person
 - Depending upon event type, hosting partner would market the event
 - if virtual, hosting partner would provide the meeting platform
 - if in-person, hosting partner would provide the space/venue for the event

Examples:

- Reverse vendor fairs vendors participate as exhibitors sharing their goods or services offerings – purchasing agents from your agency are invited to see and hear (example: Raleigh Small Business Expo)
- Meet the purchaser Agency would facilitate an introduction to purchasers within their agencies and provide information on how to conduct business with each participant. (example: DHHS and DMVA, DIT, DOA/Revenue/DOT)

State and local government Agency related training opportunities

- Train the Trainer HUB provides training to assist your staff in providing HUB certification information with the goal of increasing vendors that are certified.
- Vendor search training monthly online and may be available by request (depending on what else we have lined up and amount of notice)



Increasing your Power of connecting with Vendors

- Post solicitations (HUB Solicitation Portal)
- Share solicitation methods
- Share how To Access Direct Solicitation Informal Vendor Quote/RFQ/Informal Quote
 Pdf (How Do We Increase Awareness For Hub Vendors In This Area)
- Share Forecasting for upcoming projects
- Share special events (holidays/recognitions pertaining to your industry)
- Request proclamations to support industry nationally recognized milestones or days
